## **HEARING LOSS & DIABETES**

## Early hearing checks and treatment can make a difference.

What do hearing loss and diabetes have in common? They're both prevalent public-health challenges affecting millions of people across the United States and around the world.

**About 48 million U.S. children and adults have some form of hearing loss,** according to Johns Hopkins research, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that diabetes — a chronic metabolic disease — affects more than 29 million Americans alone.

**But did you know** that diabetes and hearing loss may share an even closer connection?

- + Hearing disorders are twice as common in people with diabetes.
- → People with diabetes can have a harder time hearing speech in noisy environments.
- → Both age-related and diabetes-related hearing problems commonly affect higher-frequency hearing, making it more difficult to hear in background noise.
- → The rate of hearing loss among people with prediabetes is 30 percent greater than for those with normal bloodsugar levels.

It's not yet known all the ways that diabetes and hearing impairment are linked, but research has identified poor blood flow to the cochlea or inner ear as a potential culprit in hearing loss among diabetic patients.

As evidence of links between hearing loss and diabetes continues to grow, researchers recommend that annual hearing evaluations be a standard part of the health care regimen for people with diabetes.

What can you do? Stick to regular hearing care, which can make a big difference in overall wellness and quality of life. Diabetes-related hearing loss could affect one or both ears, may occur gradually or suddenly, and could appear with or without balance-related problems, but routine hearing checks can help identify potential problems early.
